But, until I began to write this document I did not know why Christian Burial was so important that people would risk their lives and fortunes for it. It has always been expensive.

# God himself buried Moses' Body

Like planting a seed in consecrated ground (outside the Promised Land), for the resurrection of the body (a resurrection of Christ analogy), for respect for the Image of God, for respect for the Temple of the Holy Spirit, God himself buried Moses' body. For their evil sins against him, God also destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah. After being burned, to this day the soil of that very large area cannot produce because the brimstone completely burnt the fertilizer.

## Non Christian Burial a Curse

- 1 Kings 13:22: A prophet disobeyed God by eating a meal in a forbidden location. God laid a curse on him: that his body would not be buried in the tomb of his fathers. Shortly after, the prophet was attacked by a lion and his remains left on a road.
- Jeremiah 16:6: God laid a horrible curse on the Israelites: that many would die of diseases, will not be mourned, and would be "like refuse lying on the ground" (NIV). Their bodies were to be consumed by animals and birds.
- Jeremiah 22:19: Because of his pride and disobedience, God laid a similar curse on Jehoiakim. Jeremiah said that he would be given the burial of a donkey: to be dragged away and thrown outside the city gates.

# What does The Bible say about Cremation?

The Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) has a few references to disposal by burning in fire. Burning of bodies and objects in ancient Israel were mostly reserved for idols, criminals or enemies.

# Burning reserved for idols, criminals and enemies

## **Criminals - Prostitution**

Genesis 38:24: Judah initially ordered his pregnant daughter-in-law to be burned to death because she was guilty of prostitution. This action would have caused the death of the woman and her twin fetuses.

# **Israelite Idols**

Exodus 32:20: By burning it, Moses destroyed the golden calf.

# **Criminals - Sins against God**

Leviticus 20:14: If a man marries both a woman and her mother, then all three "must be burned in the fire" (NIV).

## **Criminals**

Leviticus 21:9: If the daughter of a priest becomes a prostitute, then she "must be burned in the fire." (NIV)

## **Rebels or Enemies**

Numbers 16:35: God exterminated Korah and 250 Israelite men with fire because they opposed Moses.

# **Idols of Pagan Gods**

Deuteronomy 7:25: God commanded that the idols of Pagan Gods be destroyed with fire.

### **Criminals - Rebels**

Joshua 7:15-25: After Joshua and his army exterminated the men, women and innocent children of Jericho, a few soldiers disobeyed God's command and looted the city. As punishment for the theft, and to pay for Israel's disgrace, God ordered the thieves to be burned. They were stoned to death; their bodies were burned and buried in what was called the *Valley of Achor*.

### Idols to Baal

2 Kings 10:26: Jehu demolished a temple consecrated to the god Baal and burned its sacred stone.

### **Curse of Cremation**

Jeremiah 29:22: This verse contains a curse which refers to the time that the Babylonians burned Zedekiah and Ahab by fire.

#### **Curse of Cremation**

Amos 2:1: God proclaimed a death curse on Moab because he had reduced the bones of the king of Edom to lime through burning.

# **Sorcerers Understood Burning**

Acts 19:19: Once converted to Christianity, Sorcerers brought their scrolls to be burned.

# And Finally, the Lake of Fire

Revelation 20:15: The fate of those whose names were not written in the Book of Life is to be thrown into the Lake of Fire.

## A Public Profession of Materialism: Cremation

For many, cremation is a public profession of irreligion or materialism. Materialists believe people are basically nothing more than that of which they are made: fertilizer. However since we are all created to worship, the materialist's natural idol (the only thing left to worship) is public opinion. So, cremation is a public profession for people who worship fertilizer.
